

2 Install procedures and initial settings

- 1. Sign in with your Apple ID.
 - Tap the search icon \bigcirc in the bottom right corner of the "App Store" screen.
- 2. Type the App name "ALLUX2" into the Search field. Tap the "Search" button on the keyboard.





The following QR code can be used to install.



3. After the search results are displayed, tap the target App as shown below.




- 4. Tap the "GET" button, then tap the "INSTALL" button.
- 5. After the installation is completed, the icon of the App is created on the home screen of the smartphone.
- 6. Tap the icon to start the App.


Tap the icon of this App to start.



After the company logo is displayed on screen for a second, this screen automatically changed to the next screen.




"Enter Password" screen is displayed. Enter the indicated password in the instruction manual. If you fail in entering the password 3 times, you need to restart this App.





The "Legal & Regulatory" dialog is displayed. Read it and tap the "OK" button.



The "App user profile" is displayed. Enter each information and tap the "OK" button.



Company name:

Enter the P&O Clinic name or company that App user works for.

Age:

Select the age of the adjuster from the list.

Gender:


Select the gender of the adjuster from the list.

Initial settings

The "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen is displayed. 6)



- 1. On the "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen, scanning for wireless devices automatically starts.
- 2. The devices related to ALLUXTM are listed up. The indicated characters vary based on the serial number of ALLUXTM. The third line indicates the connection state.
 - Disconnected
 - Connecting
 - Connected
- 3. "ALLUX:Serial No" is displayed. If more than one device is listed up, according to the Serial No. of your own ALLUXTM, select the appropriate wireless device.
- 4. If the wireless device for ALLUXTM is not listed, the wireless connection of ALLUXTM may be in sleep mode. Try to activate the wireless connection with slightly flexing and extending ALLUXTM or applying user's body weight on ALLUXTM. After that, tap the "Cancel" button and then tap the "Scan" button displayed in that position to search for wireless devices again.
- 5. Tap the wireless device on the list. If the wireless connection is successfully done, "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen is displayed automatically. For consecutive connections, the "Connection to ALLUXTM screen is skipped and the initial startup screen is displayed.
- 7) "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen is displayed. On the "Connection to ALLUXTM", you need to enter the password that comes with ALLUXTM. The password is indicated on the charging port of ALLUX™. If you fail in entering the password 3 times, you need to restart this App.





Safe posture

Before changing the operational mode of ALLUXTM using the Remote Control App or before adjusting or setting ALLUXTM using this App, the user needs to take a posture which is safe even if hydraulic resistance changes. This posture is referred to as 'safe posture'. Explain to the user about safe posture.



- Explain to the user about the safe posture, and ensure that the user understands it.
- When the user takes the safe posture without applying the body weight to ALLUXTM, he/she must hold a handrail or sit down. Flexion/extension resistance may suddenly change, leading to a fall.

[Safe posture]




: State where ALLUXTM is stationary, straight, and vertical and may be subject to weight loading



State where ALLUXTM is not subject to weight bearing and the knee may be flexed and stationary.

[Request for safe posture]

If ALLUXTM is not in the safe posture when adjusting or setting ALLUXTM, a popup is displayed. Make sure that the user is in a safe posture, and then tap the "OK" button to reflect the adjustments or settings. If you tap the "Cancel" button, the adjustments or settings will be cancelled.



5 Communication mode and how to connect Bluetooth

In order to conserve power, ALLUXTM is not always in communication mode.

In order to enable the communication mode, you need to perform the following operations.

Once ALLUXTM communication is established using this App, this state lasts until communication is disconnected.

[Communication mode enabled]

- 1. For 120 seconds after ALLUXTM is slightly flexed and extended
- 2. For 120 seconds after the user applies his/her body weight to ALLUXTM
- For 120 seconds after the charger or the power OFF cap is disconnected from ALLUXTM








With the Remote Control App, it is possible to turn OFF wireless connection when the user gets on a plane, etc. To restore wireless connection from that state, the actions such as the one shown below are required.

- 1. Disconnect the charger or the power OFF cap form ALLUX™.
- 2. "Apply a load on the heel 4 times intermittently" or "Apply a load on the toe 4 times intermittently". *You can switch to either one you like with the Remote Control App.



- *Just starting this App does not connect to ALLUXTM. Tap the Bluetooth icon on the initial startup screen (Refer to page 10) to connect to ALLUXTM.
- *Just tapping the home button etc. on the smartphone does not disconnect communication with ALLUXTM and this App keeps working behind the screen. If you tap the icon of this App again, it starts in the connected state.



■ Do not force-quit this App by turning off the smartphone.

Doing so may cause adjustment values to turn into an unintended state and result in a fall.

Common operation as to the initial startup and each screen

At the first start-up, the initial startup screen is displayed after the "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen. At the second and subsequent startups in the normal state, the initial startup screen is displayed after the company logo.



Back icon:

Tap this icon \(\) to display the previous screen.

Bluetooth icon:

Tap this icon to display the "Connection to ALLUXTM" screen. The icon changes depending on the connection state. When it is in a disconnected state, tap the icon to enable connection.



General icon:

Tap this icon ! to display the "General" screen.

Standby mark:



While this App is communicating with ALLUXTM or performing other processing, a circle standby mark is displayed. While this mark is displayed, all on-screen operations are disabled.

Latest adjustment date:

It shows the date when ALLUXTM was in last adjusted.

Battery level:

It shows the battery level of ALLUXTM.




- Basic setting button: Tap this button to display the "Basic setting" screen (page 12).
- Advanced Adjustments button: Tap this button to display the "Advanced Adjustments" screen (page 23).
- Remote Control button: Tap this button to display the "Remote Control" screen (page 24).
- Data Copy button: Tap this button to display the "Data Copy" screen (page 29).
- Gait Data button: Tap this button to display the "Gait Data" screen (page 30).
- Adjustment History button: Tap this button to display the "Adjustment History" screen (page 33).

Adjustment procedure

Adjustments are undertaken in the following steps.


Initial set-up screen

Basic Settings

*When this screen is displayed, the setting items in the lower part may not be displayed. Swipe the screen upward to display those setting items.



- Time Zone: Tap this button to display the "Time Zone" screen (page 13).
- Calibration: Tap this button to display the popup for calibration dialog (page 14).
- Vibration demo:

ALLUXTM vibrates to give information and warnings to the user. By tapping these buttons, the user can recognize vibration patterns. Please have the user understand the types and meanings of the vibration alarm patterns.

When you tap each button, the popup for a vibration alarm pattern corresponding to the button is displayed. Tap the "OK" button to vibrate ALLUXTM.

- Safety Posture: ALLUXTM vibrates when the user should take a safe posture.
- Battery (Fine): ALLUXTM vibrates when the remaining battery level is 3 hours or more.
- Battery (Low): ALLUXTM vibrates when the remaining battery level is less than 3 hours.
- Battery (Very Low): ALLUXTM vibrates when the remaining battery level is insufficient and normal walking is impossible.
- High temp warning: ALLUXTM vibrates when the knee joint is in high temperature.
- Malfunction: ALLUXTM vibrates when the knee joint needs service.
- Safety Lock: ALLUXTM vibrates when the safety lock is turned on.
- Reboot: ALLUXTM vibrates when ALLUXTM is rebooted.
- Release from airplane mode: ALLUXTM vibrates when the airplane mode is turned off. (page 9)
- Stop vibration demo: ALLUXTM stops vibration.



■ Make sure the user recognizes all vibration patterns and understands the differences. If the user uses ALLUXTM without understanding the meanings of the vibrations, he/she may not be in a safe posture against a warning about failure or high temperature and may fall because the ALLUXTM is locked when he/she tries to walk.


- Back button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Toe Release Point" adjustment screen.

Setting the Time Zone

Setting the Time Zone 9

ALLUXTM contains an internal clock used to keep records of the number of steps taken per day. The default setting is Japan Standard Time (GMT+09:00). Please change the time zone to reflect the local time.

- 1. Tap the Time Zone picker to display the time zone list.
- 2. Select the time zone of user's location.
- 3. Tap the "Settings" button to send the time zone to ALLUXTM.
 - *Once selected, it is unnecessary to repeat this step unless there is a permanent relocation to another time zone. It is also unnecessary to select it again when the user travels overseas for a short period of time. Note, however, that the time zone selected here becomes the standard time zone for when the day changes.





- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Basic setting" screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Settings button: Tap this button to send the time zone to ALLUX™.

When ALLUX[™] is used for the first time or re-aligned or the foot part is replaced, ALLUX[™] will need to be calibrated.

> ■ Calibrate ALLUXTM in the correct posture. If it is calibrated under load, the user cannot walk normally and may stumble, possibly resulting in an injury.



- When calibrating, make sure the user is safe. If the user stands on one foot in an unstable state they may fall.
- Calibrate with definitive components attached and fully tightened. If alignment adjustments are made, ALLUXTM may not work properly.
- Apply the toe release point setting (see Chapter 11) after calibration. The setting the Toe Release Point prior to calibration may make normal walking impossible or unsafe.



- Tap the "Calibration" button on the "Basic setting" screen, a popup is displayed.
- Have the user lift his/her foot to keep ALLUX[™] free from load.
 - * Have the user hold a handrail in parallel bars or sit on a chair to ensure his/her safety.
- Tap the "OK" button on the popup.
- The popup closes and the screen returns to the "Basic setting" screen.

Adjusting the Toe Release Point

Factory default setting = 80


Set the Toe Release Point for transition to the swing phase. Check the walking condition in parallel bars where the user's safety can be ensured.



Check the walking condition in a place, e.g. in parallel bars, where the user's safety can be ensured.

If $\mathsf{ALLUX}^\mathsf{TM}$ cannot smoothly shift to swing phase, user may fall.

- 1. Have the user stand in parallel bars and place the prosthetic foot behind them and load the prosthesis simulating terminal stance.
- 2. The amount of toe load will be displayed on the display bar.
- 3. Set the adjustment value to the maximum sensor output value (It is indicated as a red line).
- 4. Test by having the user walk slowly.
 - *If ALLUXTM releases with every step, gradually increase until it sticks, then reduce approximately five points.
 - *If ALLUXTM fails to release with every step, reduce the value until it releases with every step when walking slowly.
- 5. When complete, tap "Next" button to move to the "Stance Flexion Yielding" adjustment screen.



Adjustment value (min: 0, max: 200):

A toe release point adjustment value is displayed and entered in figures.

Adjustment value stepper:

These buttons increase or decrease the adjustment value in increments of 1.

Bar meter box view:

It shows the sensor output during ambulation.

Adjustment value slider:

- *Adjustments can be made by any of the three options: direct number input, + or - buttons, or click and drag.
- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Basic setting" screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Stance" Flexion Yielding" adjustment screen.

Adjusting the Stance Flexion Yielding

Factory default setting = 20 (Standard value: 15 ~ 25)


Adjust the yielding resistance so that the user feels balanced when sitting into a chair, or walking down stairs and slopes. Gradually increase or decrease the value according to the user's preference and always ensure they are standing safely prior to making adjustments. It is recommended to adjust the resistance at a normal temperature (+20°C/+68°F).



■ When ALLUX[™] is used in a low-temperature environment (0°C/+32°F or less), the yielding resistance may be higher. Check the yielding resistance before starting use in a low-temperature environment. Since ALLUX™ cannot be easily flexed, the user may fall on stairs or slope.



- Do not touch the linkage parts on ALLUXTM when standing up to avoid potential pinching.
- The yielding resistance, for walking downstairs or slopes, should be adjusted after completion of all adjustment. If the adjustments have not been made sufficiently, the user may fall on stairs or slopes.
- 1. Adjust the resistance so that the user's weight is applied equally to both feet when the user sits on a chair.
 - *If the resistance is low, increase the adjustment value.
 - *If the resistance is high, decrease the adjustment value.



Adjustment value (min: 0, max: 40):

A stance flexion yielding adjustment value is displayed and entered in figures.

Adjustment value stepper:

These buttons increase or decrease the adjustment value in increments of 1.

Adjustment value slider:

- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Toe Release" Point" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Stance Extension Dampening" adjustment screen.

Adjusting the Stance Extension Dampening

Factory default setting = 5 (Standard value: 0 ~ 25)

Normally, set the extension resistance in stance phase to 5, no resistance state. Adjust the resistance only when the user walks with stance flexion. It is recommended to adjust the resistance at a normal temperature (+20°C/+68°F).




■ When ALLUXTM is used in a low-temperature environment (0°C/+32°F or less), the stance extension dampening may be increased. Check the extension resistance before starting use in a low-temperature environment. Since ALLUXTM cannot be easily extended, the user may stumble and then fall when initiating swing phase.



- Check the walking condition in a place, e.g. in parallel bars, where the user's safety can be ensured.
- The user must walk in such a way that the knee shifts to the swing phase after it is extended.

Since ALLUXTM cannot shift to the swing phase in flexed state for double knee motion, the user may stumble and then fall.

- Adjust the resistance for stance extension dampening.
 - *If the resistance is low, increase the adjustment value.
 - *If the resistance is high, decrease the adjustment value.



Adjustment value (min: 0, max: 40):

A stance extension dampening adjustment value is displayed and entered in figures.

Adjustment value stepper:

These buttons increase or decrease the adjustment value in increments of 1.

Adjustment value slider:

- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Stance Flexion Yielding" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Swing Flexion" adjustment screen.

Adjusting the Swing Flexion Resistance

Factory default setting = 20 (Standard value: 15 ~ 35)

Adjusts the flexion resistance during swing phase. After the resistance is adjusted, based on normal walking, the knee joint will automatically adjust the flexion resistance according to the walking speed.




Evaluate the walking function in a place, e.g. in parallel bars, where the user's safety can be ensured.

If ALLUXTM cannot smoothly shift to swing phase, the user may fall.

*If the foot scuffs the floor because ALLUXTM didn't trigger swing phase, re-adjust the Toe Release Point as stated in "Adjusting the Toe Release Point" (page 15).

- 1. Adjust the Swing Flexion Resistance for normal walking speeds.
 - *If there is excessive heel rise, the resistance is low, increase the adjustment value.
 - *If the toes scuff the ground, the resistance is high, decrease the adjustment value.



Adjustment value (min: 1, max: 50):

A swing flexion resistance adjustment value is displayed and entered in figures.

Adjustment value stepper:

These buttons increase or decrease the adjustment value in increments of 1.

Adjustment value slider:

- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Stance Extension Dampening" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Terminal Impact" adjustment screen.

Adjusting the Terminal Impact

Factory default setting = 5 (Standard value: 0 ~ 25)


Adjust the extension resistance during swing phase. If terminal impact occurs, gradually increase it. After the resistance is adjusted based on the normal walking, ALLUXTM will automatically adjust the extension resistance according to the walking speed.



Evaluate the walking function in a place, e.g. in parallel bars, where the user's safety can be ensured.

If the resistance is set too high, ALLUXTM cannot extend completely, and the user may fall.

- 1. Adjust the terminal impact resistance for normal walking speed.
 - *If the resistance is low, increase the adjustment value.
 - *If the resistance is high, decrease the adjustment value.



Adjustment value (min: 0, max: 40):

A terminal impact adjustment value is displayed and entered in figures.

Adjustment value stepper:

These buttons increases or decreases the adjustment value in increments of 1.


Adjustment value slider:

- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Swing" Flexion" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Safety Lock" adjustment screen.

16 **Adjusting the Safety Lock**

Factory default setting = Invalid

The Safety Lock is designed to lock ALLUX[™] at a flexed angle in which the user stops for a certain time with ALLUX™ flexed under a certain level of weight. To use the Safety Lock, adjust the slider to set the activation time.






■ Check the function in a place, e.g. in parallel bars, where the user's safety can be ensured.

If the user is not familiar with the safety lock, he/she may inadvertently unlock the ALLUXTM, and ALLUXTM may buckle.

- *Before setting the safety lock, ensure that the user understands the function and is sufficiently trained.
- 1. Adjust the sensitivity of the safety lock. If Quick is selected, the knee will lock even with a short-term suspension.
 - *If Deactivated is selected, the safety lock will not function.



Adjustment value slider:

This slider is used to set an approximate time (See below.) to activate the safety lock.

- Very Slow: About 3 seconds
- Slow: About 2 seconds
- Normal: About 1.5 seconds
- Quick: About 1 second
- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Terminal Impact" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Low Battery" setting screen.

Low Battery settings

Factory default setting = High Resistance (Equivalent to the flexion resistance 30)


Adjust the settings for low battery situations.



If Free is selected, make sure the user can walk in a free swing state. The user can test the free swing state by selecting the free swing mode on the Remote Control Screen.

The user may not be able to move to a safe place because of the low battery.

1. Select the flexion resistance when the battery is almost depleted.



Low Battery setting picker:

Tap this picker to select a resistance when the battery is low from the following options.

- High Resistance (recommended): The flexion resistance is equivalent to the stance flexion yielding adjustment value 30.
- Free:

There is no flexion resistance.

*Whichever you select, the extension resistance becomes free.

- Back button: Tap this button to display the "Safety Lock" adjustment screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Save data" screen.

Saving the adjustment data


The adjustment or set data is automatically stored in ALLUXTM.

These data can be saved to a folder on the smartphone.

The saved data can be used by copying the data (page 29).

Even if the setting data is not saved, the setting data for the past 5 days is automatically saved in the Adjustment History (Refer to page 33).

- 1. Tap the "Save data" button.
- 2. While it is saving, a standby mark is displayed and any operation is not accepted.
- 3. After the saving is completed, a popup is displayed.
- 4. Tap the "OK" button to return to the "Save data" screen.



Save data button:

Tap this button to save data.

The saved data can be used from the "Data Copy" screen (Refer to page 29).

Close button:

Tap this button to terminate the connection with ALLUX TM and exit this App.


- Back button: Tap this button to return to the previous screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.



Advanced Adjustments 19

The settings previously described in Chapters 10 to 17 can be collectively adjusted on this screen. We recommend you make the first adjustments on the "Basic setting" screen and make readjustments on the "Advanced Adjustments" screen from the second time. Refer to each screen described in Chapters 10 to 17 for the explanation, warnings, and cautions of each item.

*When this screen is displayed, the setting items in the lower part may not be displayed. Swipe the screen upward to display those setting items.



- Calibration: (page 14) Performs calibration.
- Toe Release Point: (page 15) Changes the toe release point adjustment value.
- Stance Flexion Yielding: (page 16) Changes the stance flexion yielding adjustment value.
- Stance Extension Dampening: (page 17) Changes the stance extension dampening adjustment value.
- Swing Flexion: (page 18) Changes the swing flexion resistance adjustment value.
- Terminal Impact: (page 19) Changes the terminal impact adjustment value.
- Safety Lock: (page 20) Selects the sensitivity of the safety lock.
- Low Battery: (page 21) Selects the flexion resistance when the battery is low.
- Back button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup
- Next button: Tap this button to display the "Save data" screen.

20.1 ALLUX™ operational modes


ALLUXTM has the following five operational modes.

[Normal mode]

The normal mode is adjusted for normal walking. Judging various walking situations and normal motions with the sensor, ALLUXTM automatically adjusts the flexion and extension.

[Flexion angle limit mode]

In flexion angle limit mode, flexion resistance is locked at a designated angle while extension resistance remains free.



[Variable selective flexion lock mode]

ALLUXTM remembers the angle at which variable selective flexion lock mode is turned on. Flexion resistance is locked when it reaches that angle while extension resistance remains free.




NOTICE

■ When the flexion angle limit mode or variable selective flexion lock mode is used, do not apply excessive force to ALLUX $^{\text{TM}}$ when contacting the stop. If an excessive impact force is applied to ALLUXTM, it may be damaged.

[Full extension lock mode]

ALLUXTM is locked in a fully extended state. (When activated with knee flexion, it will allow extension until ALLUXTM reached the extension stop). This can be used as a "Sit to Stand" feature.



[Free swing mode]

In free swing mode, ALLUXTM is kept free (resistance-free state).



20.2 Assigning operational modes to the buttons on the Remote Control App

The above operational modes can be assigned to the buttons on the Remote Control App. The normal mode is always assigned to Button 1 on the Remote Control App, and the settings of this mode are those adjusted on the "Basic setting" screen or the "Advanced Adjustments" screen.


You can freely assign the five operational modes above to buttons 2 to 5 on the Remote Control App.

Default remote controller configuration:

- Button 2: Flexion Angle Limited mode
- Button 3: Variable Selective Flexion Lock mode
- Button 4: Full Extension Lock mode
- Button 5: Free Swing mode

20.3 Remote control setting screen

*When this screen is displayed, the setting items in the lower part may not be displayed. Swipe the screen upward to display those setting items.

Deactivated switch:

When this switch is turned ON, the selected button does not work even if it is tapped on the Remote Control App. In addition, the adjustment field for each mode is hidden.


Adjustment field for each mode:

In Normal mode and Flexion Angle Limited mode, the adjustment field is displayed.

In Variable Selective Flexion Lock mode, Full Extension Lock mode, and Free Swing mode, the adjustment field is not displayed.

- Back button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.



Safety Lock:



Data Copy



- * When "Bar Chart" is selected with the "Form" picker, you cannot select "Day" with the "Period" picker.

Form picker:

You can select a chart form between "Bar Chart" and "Histogram".

Period selection picker:

Select a start date ("From") and an end date ("To") with the picker. When you select one, the other date automatically changes according to the range selected with the "Period" picker.

- Make Chart button: Tap this button to display the "Make Chart" screen.
- Make Report button: Tap this button to display the "Make Report" screen.
- Back button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.
- OK button: Tap this button to display the initial startup screen.









Image of a created report






Adjustment History






